# PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE

- Practical planning to do now:
  - So...What interests you? What are you good at?
  - Get a job
  - Help someone/others
  - Learn more about something(s) that sound truly interesting to you!
  - Cultivate relationships with teachers/mentors
  - Research employment trends/projections...how do potential jobs intersect with your strengths?

# PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE

- Try self-assessments/surveys
- Self Assessement/Career Research Tools:
  - <u>CA Career Zone</u> Provides 4 assessments: a quick assessment to measure careers to match personality, an interest profiler that relates interests to work, a skills profiler that shows careers that pertain to skillset, and a work importance profiler that measures the relative importance of different factors and qualities of work.

# PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE

#### Self Assessment/Career Research Tools:

- Occupational Outlook Handbook
- O-net online -self-report abilities, interests, skills, values, etc. and you are provided with a list of careers and pertinent information
- Connected Studios day at work videos
- <u>Personality Profile Test</u> User-friendly version of the Myers-Briggs profile.
- <u>Californiacolleges.edu</u> .links to several interest and career assessement resources

## **ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION**

#### Job Corps:

- Federally-funded program for students age 16 24, provides academic & career skills, students usually live onsite.
- Programs are 8 24 months, must apply
- So Cal Corp centers are located in LA, Long Beach, and San Bernardino.
- There are 123 in total in the US, training varies by site.

## **ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION**

- Apprenticeships provides job training for specific trade, usually paid!
  - On the job training is typical hands on experience
  - CA Dept of Industrial Relations –
     Apprenticeships search by industry & location
  - Apprenticeship.gov- government website to search for programs

## **ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION**

- Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs):
  - Provide an affordable and flexible way to learn new skills
  - Free online courses available for anyone to enroll
  - Edx.org- more MOOCs, some free
  - Coursera.org more MOOC's, some free

# WHY GO TO COLLEGE?

- Expand career options 2 or 4 year options
- Higher future earnings (depending on major)
- About 2/3 of bachelor degree programs payoff within 10 years.
- Even without economic return, there is a societal return: correlations with health, happiness and community engagement

# CA COMMUNITY COLLEGES (CCCs)

- The California Community College (CCC) system is the largest higher education system in the US:
  - One in every four CC students in the US is in CA!
  - Offers variety of career education training degrees and certification programs, as well as paths to transfer to 4-year colleges.
  - Often most affordable path to 4 year degree in CA (lowest CC tuition in the US!)

#### CALIFORNIA COMMUNITY COLLEGES

- Wide variety of career training programs available through CCC degrees or certifications, including:
  - Dental, Medical or Pharmacy Assistant
  - Auto technician
  - Paralegal, court reporter
  - Computer repair and system maintenance
  - Graphic/web design
  - Construction-related fields (electrician, etc.)

#### CALIFORNIA COMMUNITY COLLEGES

- Career & Tech training programs/certs vary by CCC, so check schools' websites. Examples:
  - <u>Cypress College</u> includes: Toyota & Lexus Specialist, Basic Airline Customer Service, USA Drone Basics
  - <u>LA Trade Tech</u> primarily technical job training
  - Golden West College

#### **CCC- COLLEGE PROMISE PROGRAM**

- Free tuition for first time\* students who are CA residents or AB 540 eligible students, up to two years tuition, for full time students
- Must submit FAFSA or CADAA but no income eligibility threshold
- Check website of your CCC of choice not all schools offer this, or may use funds to cover books, or other expenses. Not the same as CA CCP Grants

<sup>\*</sup> Excluding dual enrollment and special admit

# **CCC-TRANSFER TO UC**

- Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) program Guarantees
  - Admission from CCC to a UC in a specific major, if student meets all standards including 60 credits at CCC and GPA requirement
  - Specific pathways depending on major and CCC
  - Consult individual CCC websites/counselors and the <u>UC TAG Resource Page</u> to stay on track
- Apply for TAG by Sept. 30, before the UC App is due!

# CCC - TRANSFER TO UC - FACTS!

- For 2019, 29% of UC grads had started at at CC
- 70% of CCC applicants have been admitted to UC's every year since 2017
- CCC students can qualify for a Cal Grant while attending a CCC, and bring the Cal Grant with them when transferring to a UC.

# **CCC-TRANSFER TO CAL STATE**

- Earn an Associate of Arts for Transfer (AA-T) or Associate of Science for Transfer (AS-T) to meet requirements to transfer to a Cal State Campus.
- <u>Transfer Tool</u> tool available or visit your CCC transfer counseling center and website
- CalState Apply Transfer for detailed resources.

# **CAL STATE – EOP PROGRAM**

- Educational Opportunity Program (EOP)
  - designed to improve access of low-income, first generation and historically disadvantaged students
- Provides a comprehensive program of support services including:
  - preadmission counseling, orientation, summer program, diagnostic testing, financial aid follow-up, special admissions, tutoring, learning skill services, and personal, educational and career counseling.

# CAL STATE - EOP PROGRAM

- Check eligibility and program guidelines <u>here</u>
- Interested applicants check the appropriate EOP box on <u>Cal State Apply</u>. Must apply before you enroll!
- Apply to multiple campuses
- Special consideration given to EOP&S program students from CCCs.

# **NEED BASED FINANCIAL AID**

- See <u>YRRTF Financial Aid Presentation</u> for details on federal/state aid apps and programs
  - Federal Aid Need-based federal aid is based on a family's income, assets, and living expenses; complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
  - State Aid many need-based grants for students at CA public colleges and Universities (see additional slides for details)
- Colleges have institutional need aid as well
  - Reminder some schools also require CSS Profile form

## STATE AID - ALWAYS APPLY!

- Submit the FAFSA OR if undocumented and <u>AB 540</u>
   <u>Eligible</u>, submit the <u>California Dream Act Application</u>
- Create a WebGrants 4 Students (WG4S) Account- <u>webgrants-4-students</u> (note: CADAA applicants – this is automatically created for you)
- Check with your school to make sure it auto submits your GPA, otherwise download the form and have your school submit it <u>cal grant GPA verification form</u>

## FAFSA / CADAA HELP - CSAC

- California Student Aid Commission (CSAC)
  - Organization that processes the CADAA and is repository for many state aid programs
  - Facilitates Cash to College Workshops FREE,
     Virtual workshops to complete FAFSA, CADAA or Chafee applications
  - Multi-language, for HS and college students/families

## STATE AID – CA CCP Grant

- California Community College Promise Grant (CCCP)
  - Different than the College Promise Program
  - Waives per unit fees
  - Need-based aid for CCC, GPA requirement of 2.0
  - For CA residents and AB 540 Eligible students
  - Can apply online at some CCC websites or <u>CCCApply</u>, but by doing FAFSA or CADAA, no separate app is required for consideration

# STATE AID - CAL GRANTS A,B,C

- Cal Grants- see amounts by Institution Type
- Can be used at UC, Cal State\*, as well as qualifying independent and career colleges or technical schools in California.
- Eligibility determined based on FAFSA or CADAA and verified Cal Grant GPA, and type of college. See <u>chart</u> here.

<sup>\*</sup> CCCs are usually tuition free under CA Promise, but may be eligible for Cal Grants for other expenses

# STATE AID - OTHER

- Middle Class Scholarship provides partial scholarships (10-40% tuition/fees) to undergrads with family incomes between \$80K- \$191K at UC's/Cal States with need.
- Blue & Gold Scholarship full tuition/fee scholarships for CA residents with family income <\$80K/year w/need.</li>
- <u>CA Dream Loans</u>- loans for undergrads with CADAA app and valid AB540 affidavit for UC's/Cal States
- www.csac.ca.gov other aid programs available

# **NET PRICE CALCULATORS**

- Colleges are required to have a Net Price Calculator ((NPC) on their websites.
- Net price = the amount that a student pays to attend college in a single academic year
   AFTER subtracting scholarships and grants
- Run the NPC for schools you are considering.
- CA School Net Price Calculator List here

## FINANCIAL AID – Awards

- Schools will award financial aid packages, but they are in different forms.
- Schools are not required to provide aid to cover the entire estimated need.
- Use a standard format to compare 'apples to apples' <u>Sample cost comparison sheet</u>
